**Subject:       General Technical Requirements for Fixed Point-to-Point Radio Systems  
                  Operating in Frequency Bands above 960 MHz (SRSP-300-GEN)**

Dear Josette Gallant,

In August 2022, the Department requested the RABC review draft Issue 1 of *General Technical Requirements for Fixed Point-to-Point Radio Systems Operating in Frequency Bands above 960 MHz* (SRSP-300-GEN). This document sets out general technical requirements for the efficient use of the frequency bands above 960 MHz by point-to-point radio systems in the fixed service which are licenced in accordance with the current issue of Radio Standards Procedure RSP-113, *Application Procedures for Planned Radio Stations Above 960 MHz in the Fixed Service*.

The Board assigned the review of the standard to its Fixed Wireless Communications Committee. The Committee held four calls to review the proposed changes. Approximately 15 members participated and provided feedback to the Department. Recommended changes to the SRSP from the discussion have been captured in the attached draft document.

The Board has not yet completed its review. The Committee members continue to evaluate the values presented in Table 1 of the SRSP. The Board anticipates submitting additional comments regarding Table 1, however in order to respect the filing deadline established by the Department, we are today submitting the bulk of our comments on the SRSP. We appreciate the Department has already granted RABC a slight extension to the filing deadline.

Finally, at the request of the Department, RABC also posted the consultation on its website to facilitate comments from Canada's World Trade Organization (WTO) partners. We did not receive any comments from WTO partners.

We appreciate the opportunity to review the new standard and we hope the Department will consider our remaining comments which will be submitted shortly.
